Along with changing the format of the booklet there are many changes to summer school this year.

Please read carefully.

****New Attendance Policy**

Regular attendance is expected at summer school! If you have questions about summer school attendance, please call 715-532-4722 or email sharalyn.overhagen@flambeauschools.org.

Please notify the school office for ANY and ALL absences at **715-532-5559 option 1**. It is our policy to contact the parent/guardian each time a student is absent and not reported. *Please send a note with your child to their 1st hour teacher; or call the attendance number prior to a planned absence.* In the event of an illness, please call the attendance line the day of, or send a note the day after the absence with your child to give to their 1st hour teacher. We understand that things come up and plans have been made for summer activities, trips, etc., but the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction has new requirements in regards to attendance notification that helps ensure that we can continue to fund our Summer School Program.

When

Monday, June 11th -Thursday, July 19th

***THERE IS NO SUMMER SCHOOL THE WEEK OF JULY 2-6, 2018.**

The morning schedule will consist of three different sessions: 9-10 a.m., 10-11 a.m., and 11-12 noon.

It is important that you read the descriptions carefully. Some classes run longer than an hour, some run outside of the summer school day, some run outside of the June 11-July 19 schedule.

Who

Students who are entering 4YK through 12th grades based on 2018-2019 school year grade level.

Credit Recovery (8th-12th grades) 6/11-7/19; 9-noon: *This class may be longer for individual students, depending on the number of core classes required (parent transportation is required if attending outside of the dates stated above):* This registration process will be handled by the high school guidance office. Call 532-3183 ext. 2307

Registration Procedures (Easy as 1,2,3):

1. Complete the summer school registration form(s) and return them to the **Student Services/Health Office** or mail to: Sharalyn Overhagen, Student Services, PO Box 86, Tony WI 54563.

Our newly formatted registration forms can be found at the back of this booklet; you may print them off of our district's website at www.flambeau.k12.wi.us; or you may pick them up at the main office.

2. Registration for summer school classes will begin as soon as you receive this booklet and will end **Tuesday, May 8th.**

*****Note the registration end date as most of our classes have a maximum enrollment number and courses will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis.***

Students must be enrolled in classes for the entire morning, 9-12noon. Students must pick an alternate class for each hour. --Please **CIRCLE your first choice and **CHECK** (✓) your alternate choice.~ Every effort will be made to give students their first choice. Registrations are taken on a first come/first served basis. Class descriptions can be found starting on page 3.**

3. Certain courses may have fees attached to them for certifications and will need to be paid when registering in-person or by mail at the Student Services Office, PO Box 86, Tony, WI 54563. Your registrations will not be finalized until payment is received and the spot may be given to someone who has already paid.

Meals

Anyone (even if not enrolled in Summer School) age 18 and under is eligible for a FREE breakfast (8:30-9am) and FREE lunch (Noon-12:45pm) at the Flambeau School cafeteria from June 11 through July 19 Monday-Thursday. ***Meals are not served when summer school is not in session.***

BUSSING SCHEDULES WILL ACCOMMODATE MEAL TIMES.

Student Behavior and Discipline

All students are expected to be safe, responsible, and respectful at all times and in all areas of summer school—both on and off school grounds. In the event that a student chooses a behavior that is not safe, respectful, or responsible, the teachers/summer school administrator will attempt to address/reteach the appropriate behavior. If the behavior is repeated, presents a danger to self or others, or constitutes gross misconduct, the parent/guardian will be contacted and the student will be sent home.

Free Swimming Lessons, June 11-28

*****Something new this year***** - Non-summer school swimmers who need transportation will be transported to school with regular village pick-up students in the morning. They will be offered free breakfast and then transported to swimming lessons, leaving Flambeau at 9am and leaving the Ladysmith pool at 10:15am. See Swimming Lesson pages for times, levels, etc.

All summer school students enrolled in swimming lessons will be enrolled in Outdoor Fitness. This class will be in session until the bus leaves for the pool. (#1 12:45-1:00pm and #2 12:45-1:30pm).

Transportation

Village pick-up and drop-off is provided at no cost to parents. A complete schedule of bus routes will be provided prior to the start of summer school. Please indicate on the registration form whether or not your child will need transportation services. **There are certain classes (or parts of classes) for which the district does not provide transportation. Please read the descriptions carefully.**

Non-Discrimination Policy

It is the policy of the School District of Flambeau that no person may be denied admission to any public school in this district or be denied participation, be denied the benefits of, or be discriminated against in any curricular, extracurricular, public service, recreational, or other program or activity because of the person's race, sex, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability as required by Section 118.13 of the State Statutes and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 2005. This policy also prohibits discrimination as defined by Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972 (sex), Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (race, color, national origin), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act (handicap), and Americans with Disabilities Act of 1997 (Disability).

Students With Disabilities

The School District of Flambeau encourages students with disabilities to enroll in any appropriate district approved summer school courses. Please contact Vince Ross if your child requires any special accommodations to successfully complete summer school course requirements.

Supervision

The School District of Flambeau is responsible for the safe care and supervision of all students who are properly enrolled in the district's summer school program. Students will be supervised by summer school staff after village pick-up, during meals, and until they are dropped off at swimming lessons or village drop-off.



No drop-offs before 8:20am.

If being transported by a parent or guardian, students must be picked up each day as soon as they finish their lunch at 12:45. The school district's responsibility for safe care and supervision of students whose parents or guardians are providing transportation ends as soon as those students leave school property.

~~CLASS DESCRIPTIONS~~

4YK All I Can Be - 6/11-7/19; 9-12noon: Future cowboys and cowgirls, princes and princesses, scientists, astronauts, police officers, firemen or women, construction workers, and dreamers that are entering 4YK this fall will have a fun and active introduction to school! We will be learning about different jobs and occupations; from fun options (like superheroes, kings and queens) to real life work. If your child enjoys creative and imaginative play, they will love this opportunity to play and learn social skills, how a school runs and make new friends. They will also be learning some beginning math, literacy and science skills. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Isham

Kindergarten: Under The Sea - 6/11-7/19; 9-12noon: Let's dive into Kindergarten with whales, sharks, clown fish and more. We will be exploring water science activities combined with letters, words, shapes, colors, math and patterns. Water colors, color mixing, oil and water, and water density will be explored with hands on activities. Books, imaginary play, crafts, and fun will also be included. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Johnson

Flying Into First Grade - 6/11-7/19; 9-12noon: Exploring first grade materials, lessons, and activities. Reading and math will be emphasized each day. Engaging math activities and lessons will be part of our day as one of our learning targets. Students will use their creative minds to solve and explore math problems. Students will have fun trying out some ooey, gooey, interesting science experiments! They will learn a number of math strategies, make observations, be creative, and most of all have FUN! Highly Qualified Teacher: Ms. Felland

Second Grade Adventures - 6/11-7/19; 9-12noon: Let's go on a 2nd grade adventure with our friends! Time flies when you're having fun! This class is designed for those young learners who will be entering second grade this fall. Throughout this summer course we will be exploring science, ramping up our math skills through fun dice games and critical thinking, dabbling in some art, working on language arts with some creative writing, and fine-tuning our social skills while we work and play with our friends. 2nd grade will be here soon, and you WILL be ready! PLEASE NOTE: LIMIT OF 15 STUDENTS. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Steckel

By Invitation Only: Adventures in Reading - (2nd-4th grades) – 6/11-7/19; 9-12noon: Do you enjoy adventures and the wonderful places they take you? If so, all aboard the reading bus! Come and Join Mrs. Ellwanger and Mrs. Stoll on the reading bus, along with their friends Ms. Frizzle and the students from The Magic School Bus. Buckle your seat belts, relax, and enjoy the ride they take you on!

iPads - (4th-8th grades) - 6/11-28 & 7/9-19; 11-12noon: We will explore math, science, and word apps that make learning fun. Your child will learn how to use google maps to explore different locations around the world and our local community. We will also use some apps that allow us to manipulate pictures. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Bratanich

PE: Run Faster, Jump Higher - (5th-12th grades) - 6/11-28 & 7/9-19; 9-10am: This class is for students who are motivated to work at improving their speed and jumping capabilities. We will do many activities that involve jumping, running, and ladder drills. This class will give you some drills that you can do at home to improve your speed and jumping ability. If you take this class be ready for a challenge. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Bratanich

PE: Beginning Weightlifting for Girls - (5th-12th grades) - 6/11-28 & 7/9-19; 10-11am: In this class girls get a chance to learn about weight lifting and strengthening exercises. This class is designed for girls who want to become more physically fit and active. If you are ready to start some healthy habits think about taking this class. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Bratanich

PE: Volleyball (3rd-8th) - 6/11-28; 9-10am: Is volleyball a game you are interested in playing? If you are a beginner, you will learn the basic skills with fun drills needed to play volleyball. If you have played volleyball before, you will learn new skills and practice fun drills to help you improve your game. It will be a good opportunity if you want to learn volleyball and be fit. Open to Boys and Girls. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Cody

PE: Outdoor Activities - (3rd-8th): 6/11-28; 10-11am: Learn and do new activities to enjoy the outdoors! Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Cody

PE: Dance, Dance Revolution! - (3rd-8th) - 6/11-28; 11-12noon: Join us for a fun class, utilizing our Dance, Dance Revolution system! Stay fit with fun dance moves! Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Cody

Native American People of Wisconsin – (3rd-5th) – 6/11-28; 9-12noon

This three-week summer session will explore Native Peoples of Wisconsin. We will create art, use technology, learn from music and literature, and be given an opportunity to listen to and share with visiting speaker(s). Please note it will include a field trip that may last longer than the scheduled session times. A service component will also be incorporated into this session. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Wolbert

Fishing Exploration (3rd-5th) 6/11-15; 8am-4pm: This 5-day, outdoor educational class teaches students about various types of fish habitat, plants and animals native to our area. They will obtain the knowledge through hands-on fishing expeditions to a variety of area lakes, rivers and streams. School lunch will be provided. Students will be provided more information after registration. Session is limited to 13 students. *Students who have not taken the class in the past will be given the first chance to enroll.* **Parents must provide transportation to and from the school for this class.** Highly Qualified Teachers: Mr. Gago and Mr. Roehl

Outdoor Games - (3rd-5th) - 6/11-28; 9-10am: Join us for some outdoor fun while we play some classic and new games such as, Capture the Flag, Ultimate Ball, Tag Games, Soccer, and Yard Games. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Ridout

Math Games - (3rd-5th) - 6/11-28; 10-11am: In class you will put your math skills to work! Use your Math wits to outscore your opponent! We will play a new game every day. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Ridout

Coloring and Crafts - (3rd-5th) – 6/11-28; 11-12noon: We will use different forms of media to color such as crayons, chalk, colored pencils, and permanent markers. We will also be making our own chalk and crayons. Students will also be making their own sketch books. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Ridout

Ecology for Kids - (3rd-5th) - 6/11-28; 9-10am: Students will explore relationships in nature through hands-on activities. They will learn how animals and other organisms live in their natural surroundings and how they affect each other. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Barnett

Geography for Kids - (3rd-5th) - 6/11-28; 10-11am: Welcome to Geography! You will experience a world of fascinating discoveries, while virtually traveling from country to country! Students will receive a passport that you will have stamped throughout your travels around the globe! Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Barnett

Books And Cooks - (3rd-5th) - 6/11-28; 11-12noon: Students will read books and then do a small cooking activity. Students will create their own recipe box with the recipes they use. Use Reading, Math and Writing in a fun and creative way! Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Barnett

Performance - (3rd-8th) - 6/11-28; 9-10am: Musical choreographed theater, performing before an audience, and puppets will be covered in this highly entertaining class! Highly Qualified Teacher: Ms. Bruce

Open Tech Lab – (3rd-8th) – 6/11-28 & 7/9-19; 10-11am: Students will use computers to improve their keyboarding skills, learn “brick” based coding to do different tasks, and will do other cool stuff with computer tools in this fun and educational class! Highly Qualified Teacher: Ms. Bruce

Maker Lab: STEM Experiences – (3rd-8th) - 6/11-28; 11-12noon: For the creative spirit! Making something out of nothing – well – whatever is around. Projects include making circuit boards, computer coding, Rube Goldberg machines, and architectural design. Highly Qualified Teacher: Ms. Bruce

LitCamp® (5^h-7th) – 6/11-28; 9-12noon: LitCamp® focuses on seven strengths to help students become life-long learners and readers. It uses a variety of activities, some group, some individual, to foster those strengths along with reading skills. LitCamp® mixes fiction and non-fiction writings. If your child is in READ 180 this is a highly recommended class. Others may register. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Verdegan

WI Hunter Safety - 6/11-28; 9am-12noon:

Students who are 11 or older as of the end of the 2018 school year are encouraged to enroll. Each class is 5 days in length. The first four days will be instructional days and the fifth day will be the test day. This course is limited to 10 students per class and will be filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. **Please note: the fee is required to be paid when registering, or the student will not be registered.**

Transportation to class will be provided by the school district Monday through Thursday. **The district does not provide transportation on Fridays.**

Persons successfully completing the course will receive a distinctive embroidered emblem and hunter education graduate certificate. This certificate is a lifetime certificate required for hunting in many states and Canadian Provinces. Young students certified will also be able to hunt and use firearms without being accompanied by a parent or legal guardian at age fourteen instead of sixteen.

Classes will cover responsibilities of hunters, firearm safety in the home and afield, knowledge of firearms and hunting equipment, wildlife identification and management, marksmanship and outdoor skills.

Persons born on or after January 1, 1973, must have a Hunter Education Certificate to purchase any type of Wisconsin hunting license, including bow hunting.

There is a \$10.00 DNR fee that must accompany the registration form. Students must obtain a Wisconsin DNR Customer ID number by calling 1-888-936-7463 or by visiting a Wisconsin DNR Service Center prior to class. If the student has purchased any type of DNR license or permit, they will already have a customer number that is printed on their DNR license. **No choice of week, but we will try to accommodate vacations, etc.** Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. van Doorn

***Fee of \$10 must accompany registration or spot will be given to another student.**

Karaoke Club (3rd-8th) 7/9-19; 9-10am: To sing or not to sing? Sing of course! Have you ever wanted to make people adore you like Taylor Swift does? Did you ever want to be cool like Mick Jagger? Maybe you are shy and would never take center stage. Karaoke Club is your big chance to overcome and be heard. You choose the songs (as long as the lyrics are not insensitive to the rest of us) and we will be your audience. Be prepared to learn some tips on being a better karaoke performer, a better singer, a safe risk taker, and be loved by your adoring fans. This class will build the student’s comfort singing in front of an audience. Highly Qualified Teacher: Ms. Bruce

LEGO Machines – (3rd-8th) - 7/9-19; 11-12noon: In this class students will build a variety of LEGO machines, including simple machines and robots. For advanced robot creators (Mindstorm users), work with EV3 computer programming will be used. Highly Qualified Teacher: Ms. Bruce

PE: Basketball Drills and Skills - 7/9-12 & 7/16-19 - (3rd-5th) – 11-12noon & (6th-9th) – 9-11am: These classes are open to boys and girls. Drills will mainly focus on proper shooting form and ball handling skills. There will also be many competitive drills as well with an emphasis on learning the game of basketball and simply having fun! *Highly Qualified Teachers: 7/9-12: Mr. Steve Alberson and Mr. Zenny Mahun /7/16-19 – Mr. Ted Alberson*

Escape the Classroom - (3rd-5th) - 7/9-19; 9-10am: Students will try to find clues and solve puzzles to unlock the mystery. Will you be able to escape the classroom?? Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Ridout

Board Games - (3rd-5th) – 7/9-19; 10-11am: Students will play a variety of problem solving and strategy board games such as Monopoly, Battleship, Uno, Trivial Pursuit, Clue and many more. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Ridout

Cooking in the Classroom - (3rd-5th) - 7/9-19; 11-12noon: Students will prepare their own simple snacks. Please let the teacher know if your child has any food allergies at the time of registration so recipes and ingredients can be planned accordingly. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Ridout

Careers in Rusk (7th-9th) 7/9-19; 9-12noon: Student in grades 7-9 will investigate occupations in Rusk County and formulate questions. Field trips will be made to businesses so that students can find out the answers to their questions and see what goes on at each business. Students will spend the first days generating ideas of businesses that they want to see. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Linda Zimmer

Explore Wisconsin - (4th and 5th) – 7/23-27: Students will learn about Wisconsin history while traveling to five different locations. Trips may include Madeline Island, Crystal Cave, Hunt Hill, Fort Folle Avoine, and Lambeau Field. Trips are subject to change due to availability. A schedule will be sent to parents once registration is complete. **Parents must provide transportation to and from the school.** Highly Qualified Teachers: Mrs. Ridout, and Mrs. Poznikowich

Beginning Band - (6th) – 6/11-28; Times - (see scheduled hours below): This class is for students entering sixth grade band to introduce them to the basics of playing a musical instrument. Students must own an instrument or have made rental arrangements with Mr. Slembariski ahead of time. The class meets every day for 3 weeks and is divided into 60 minute blocks for each instrument. **Students who have not signed up for the other 2 hours of summer school must be transported by parents.** Fees: \$30 rental; \$10 for book and binder (\$14 for percussion); Drum sticks and reeds will also be an extra cost if needed. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mr. Slembariski. Schedule as follows:

9-10am: Flutes and Clarinets

10-11am: Saxophones and Trumpets

11-12noon: Trombones, Euphoniums and Percussion

Marching Fundamentals - (9th-12th) – 6/18-20; 1-5pm; includes Marching Dates: 6/10; 7/22; 7/28; 8/5; 9/3: Students will learn and review the basics of field and parade marching. Concepts to be learned include dedication to improvement, teamwork, personal responsibility, leadership, attention to detail, and performance techniques. Music and drill for the Homecoming field show will also be learned. **There is no transportation provided for this class.** Highly Qualified Teacher: Mr. Slembariski

Open Band – (6-12) – 7/9-19; 9-10am, 10-11am & 11-12noon - (you may register for one, two or all three hours): Does your band instrument just sit and collect dust over the summer? Come back for some relaxed lessons and practice room time with your instrument. Earn band karate belts, learn music for the upcoming year, or work on something of your own choosing. Whatever the reason, Mr. Slembariski is here to help fill that "bandless" void left in your life over the summer. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mr. Slembariski

School Murals (6th-12th) 6/11-28; 9-12noon: In this class we will be painting murals throughout the school to create a more cheerful and more interesting learning environment. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mrs. Torres

Middle School Band Reboot - (7th and 8th) – 8/22-24; 9-11:30am: Students will review performance and practice techniques learned throughout the previous school year. An emphasis will be placed on getting out of the summer slump and back into the playing mode. **No transportation is provided for this class.** Highly Qualified Teacher: Mr. Slembariski

Environmental Challenge - (9th-12th) – 6/11-7/20; 7-12noon: Please see Mr. Todd Roehl for information on how to apply. This course is a great opportunity for high school students to earn extra money and receive an elective credit by applying math, science, and English knowledge to outdoor challenges. Students will be developing job skills, such as completing applications, learning about the interview process, and carrying out work responsibilities. **Students work 5 hours per day; 7-12noon; five days per week for five weeks on an environmental project with a DNR mentor, environmental science intern and high school instructor.** Please note: **Parents or students must provide transportation to and from the school; students must provide their own meals;** exact schedules will be provided after enrollment. Enrollment is limited. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mr. Roehl

Outdoor Fitness: All students enrolled in Swim Lesson after Summer School. (12:45-1:30pm) A supervised and structured time to learn ways to keep healthy and fit when you are outside. Highly Qualified Teacher: Mr. Ross
