The School District of Flambeau is offering summer school opportunities this summer. This is a great opportunity for your child to explore more of their interests and expand their knowledge.

Dates and Times:

June 10th – June 28th Monday – Thursday

Classes run in three blocks:

o Block A: 8:25 a.m. – 9:30 a.m. o Block B: 9:30 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. o Block C: 10:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.

Sign Up Procedure and Information:

- 1. Sit down with your child and go over the choices available at his/her grade level.
- 2. Fill out the class sign-up form online (https://forms.gle/uCnYkDwf1aLomd51A) found on the district website. You may also fill in the paper form below and return it to your child's homeroom teacher or the District Office. **Note:** Your child does not have to take three classes. They can take one, two, or three if they so choose. Please remember if your child will not be here for the entire half day, you will need to provide transportation home.
- 3. All classes are assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis. Some classes may not run if there are not enough registrants. You will receive a confirmation list of your child's classes. If a class is canceled your child will have an opportunity to sign-up for another selection.
- 4. The registration deadline is **Friday**, **May 3rd**.
- 5. Verification of class assignments will be sent home with the student the week of May 20th-May 24th.
- 6. Pick-up and drop-off for students being transported by their parents/guardians will be at the front door S2. For students being transported by bus, this will take place at the normal location; doors by the MS/HS IMC.
- 7. Students are not allowed to be dropped off before 7:45 a.m.
- 8. Students are NOT allowed on campus unless they are enrolled in summer school classes.
- 9. Breakfast will begin at 7:55 a.m.
- 10. Lunch will begin at 11:30 a.m.
- 11. If your child(ren) **REQUIRES** bus transportation, you are required to choose classes from all four (3) sessions and please do not forget to sign the forms!



Swimming Lessons Grades Eligible: 4YK-8

Note: Students will not be allowed to choose the time of their swim session. If your student is in grades 2,4,6 or 8 they will not be able to be in a Block C class due to swim lesson timing.

Summer Slide Masters Grades Eligible: 3-5

Book Cooks Grades Eligible: 2-4 & 5-8

Stir up a batch of eager readers with "Book Cooks" literature-based classroom cooking activities. Favorite children's books inspire all recipes and will motivate young readers to enjoy hands-on cooking experiences. Students will practice math and reading skills, learn science concepts, work cooperatively, develop good work habits, build self-confidence, and bring recipes home to share with family and friends.

<u>Chemistry for Kids</u> <u>Grades Eligible: 2-4</u>

Students will be engaged in hands-on activities to observe chemical reactions where they will see evidence of chemical change and other related activities in the field of chemistry.

Counted Cross-Stitch Grades Eligible: 4-12

This is open to 4-12 graders. Students do need to be able to count well to at least 20. Beginners will work on a butterfly design while learning how to find the center of the pattern, find the center of the material, separate thread, thread a needle, read a pattern, and stitch the pattern onto the material using the X method. Intermediate students

are welcome to bring in their own materials, but the focus will be on French knots and backstitching. These two things add details to patterns. Depending on availability, bookmarks may be made.

Chemistry for Teens

Grades Eligible: 5-8

Students will be engaged in cross-curricular fun activities in the science discipline(including Chemistry, physics, and biology)

Soccer for Beginners

Grades Eligible: 3-8

Students will have health benefits including increased aerobic capacity and cardiovascular health, engaged motor skills, specifically hand and eye coordination, and improved muscle tone.

Grades Eligible: 2-3

What's better than MESSY FUN? Come join me this summer while we use science to make awesome dough, goop, and slime creations! We will make our creations with simple ingredients that you probably have at home, and you will get a recipe card for each one! This class does not come without a challenge... are you able to make ooey, gooey, soft, and mushy, and keep them away from Oliver? (Limit 10 students)

Cribbage for Beginners

Grades Eligible: 4-12

This class is designed to develop the love of cribbage in students. Cribbage is a life-long skill to be enjoyed. It has been around since the 1600s. It does require students to have some basic math skills (adding and subtracting). Points are scored for card combinations that add up to fifteen and for pairs, triples, quadruples, runs, and flushes. Boards and cards will be provided.

Fairytale Study: Cinderella

Grades Eligible: 6-8

Read the classic fairytale *Cinderella* and many of its variations. This class is meant for struggling readers as it will focus on various reading strategies: cause and effect, prediction, compare and contrast, character analysis, sequencing,.....

Grades Eligible: 2-3

Students will learn the foundations of coding and computational thinking through coding with Scratch Jr. Students will make animations and games as they learn.

Students will make fun animations and games as they learn the foundations of computer science. Students will learn the block-based programming language Scratch.

Grades Eligible: Students entering 4YK in September 2024

We will be learning about different jobs and occupations; from fun options (like superheroes, kings, and queens) to real-life work (like farmers, teachers, and cooks). If your child enjoys creative and imaginative play, they will love this opportunity to play and learn social skills, check out a school day, and make new friends. They will also be exploring beginning math, writing, literacy, and science activities.

Grades Eligible: K

First Grade Frenzy!

Grades Eligible: 1

This class will run consecutively through all three sessions for incoming first-grade students.

Students going into first grade will be introduced to first-grade lessons, materials, and activities. Reading, Writing, Math, and STEAM will be focused on each day with various engaging activities both inside and outside of the classroom. Come learn, play with friends, and have some fun!

Reading Rockets

Grades Eligible: 2-5

Reading Rockets is designed to empower students with the foundational reading skills they need to succeed academically and beyond. By addressing their individual needs and providing fun hands-on learning activities, we aim to instill a love for reading and equip students with the tools they need to become confident readers. Band Lessons

Grades Eligible: 6-12

Individual or small group lessons for the Middle School band (and interested High School) meet either once or twice a week, depending on the student's interests and schedules. Lessons last half an hour. Sixth graders who will be in band in the fall are especially encouraged to sign up for summer lessons - or at least come in to test-play instruments so we can figure out what they will end up playing.

Basketball Camp

Grades Eligible: 3-12

Will be held: July 8th-12th

Monday – Friday: 3rd-12th Graders will be from 4:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. with the Activity Bus doing Village pick-ups/drop-offs

Basketball camp is open for all players (beginners to those with experience), looking to improve their basketball skills and knowledge of the game. During camp, we will work on skills such as ball handling, shooting, passing, defense, and more. There will also be an emphasis on creating an environment that is competitive, challenging, and fun with many team and individual player games and drills. We hope all players who come to camp leave feeling more excited and confident about playing basketball.

Credit Recovery Grades Eliqible: 9-12

What is credit recovery you ask? Credit recovery is a strategy that encourages students to fulfill the credit requirement for graduation if they have fallen behind. The setting for credit recovery is very relaxed which aids in student success. Students will receive a syllabus with a timeline of when work is to be completed and turned in. A student may be referred by staff or administration. Classes begin on June 10th - ? They will be held Monday – Thursday every week. This class will run consecutively through all four sessions.

Environmental Challenge

Students take on several projects that allow them to build teamwork skills, and to protect and conserve our environment within our community. This is a great program that allows students to learn to be good stewards of the earth while helping out the community's environment! Students will also learn the importance of regulations and steps that go along with the work they're performing. Students who participate in this class will receive a stipend after they have completed this environmental stewardship. Get ready to make a difference in our local community! If selected for the program, you will be contacted by the teacher to inform you of the start and end dates. This program doesn't run with the summer school schedule and students will need to provide their own transportation to and from the school.

Explore Wisconsin Eligible Grades: 3-5

Will be held July 15th – July 19th

Explore Wisconsin gives students the unique chance to travel across Wisconsin learning about its history, culture, and topography by exploring different locations. A full week is required for this exciting summer school opportunity. Trips may include hikes, swimming, spelunking, museums, zoos, and many other experiences.

This is an enrichment program being offered to students with proven exemplary behavior in school, on the school bus, and on field trips. Participants are expected to represent the most outstanding citizenship qualities of a Flambeau student.

The current schedule is as follows:

Important items to note regarding this class:

- Parents MUST provide transportation to and from school at scheduled times and may include EVENING pickups.
- Students must have a home-packed lunch, snack, and/or supper WITH NO SODA ALLOWED.
- Exact schedules will be provided after enrollment is confirmed.
- Enrollment is limited.

Grades Eligible: 9-12

Strength and Conditioning - 6:00 am-8:00 am

This class is much more than just an open weight room. Students will spend the first 15 minutes in the classroom watching videos and learning the proper way to lift weights and run. We will also discuss nutrition. You will learn how to stay fit and/or become bigger, faster, and stronger. Students will perform warm-ups, which will consist of a jog, speed lines, and dynamic stretching. In addition, students will be lifting weights and running. We will lift and do agility on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays. Each day we will work in so Physical Education type games as well. This is a great summer school class for both males and females! Your effort in the off-season will greatly increase your success during the season.

Drivers Education

Student must be age 14 ½ by June 1st

Grades Eligible: 5-12

Driver Education is essential to encourage responsible drivers who understand the components of the highway transportation system and who participate in the system safely. The State of Wisconsin requires **30 HOURS** of classroom instruction, **6 HOURS** of behind-the-wheel, and **6 HOURS** of observation in the car to meet these needs. (Additionally, it is very important for parents to continue to monitor the driving of their children and model safe and appropriate driving skills. The most vulnerable time for students will be a few months after they get their licenses as they may become overconfident.)

CLASSROOM:

- 1. 30 hours of classroom instruction will be provided.
- 2. STUDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ATTENDING ALL CLASS SESSIONS
- 3. Drive Right Text and accompanying assignments will be used.
- 4. Assignments must be neatly completed and turned in on time.

BEHIND-THE-WHEEL:

- 1. Students must maintain a "C" average in Driver Education to begin the Behind-the-wheel phase of Drivers Education.
- 2. Age and grades will be taken into consideration when scheduling is done.
- 3. Students must have their Driver's Permit on their person to drive.
- 4. Students must contact Mr. Zeman **DIRECTLY** if they are unable to make a Behind-the-wheel appointment.
- 5. Completions of the Behind-the-wheel is only one step along the way to becoming a good driver much additional practice is needed.

Please note that the on-street phase of Drivers Education is **FLEXIBLE. The student may lose his or her place on the driving schedule if he or she violates any of the course rules or does not develop through practice outside of class.**

Hooked on Fishing

Grades Eligible: 4-6

This 5-day, all-day-long (8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.), outdoor educational class teaches you about various types of fish habitat, plants, and animals native to our area. You will obtain the knowledge through hands-on fishing expeditions to a variety of areas lakes, rivers, and streams. Students will eat breakfast before leaving the school grounds and school lunch will be provided. Students who have not taken the class in the past will be given the first chance to enroll. Students should bring bug spray, sunscreen, and snacks. All fishing bait and tackle will be provided. A list of locations will be provided after registration is complete. Group 1 is scheduled for June 3rd – June 7th and Group 2 is scheduled for June 10th – June 14th. Students who elect to participate in this class and need transportation will ride the bus to school Monday through Thursday as normal.
