The School District of Flambeau is offering Discovery Days Summer Program opportunities this summer. This is a great opportunity for your child to explore more of their interests and expand their knowledge.

Dates and Times: June 9th – June 26th Monday – Thursday

Classes run in three blocks:

- oBlock A: 8:25 a.m. – 9:30 a.m.
- oBlock B: 9:30 a.m. – 10:30 a.m.
- oBlock C: 10:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.

Sign Up Procedure and Information:

1. Sit down with your child and go over the choices available **at his/her grade level they will be entering for the 2025/2026 school year.**
2. Fill out the class sign-up form online (<https://forms.gle/uCnYkDwflaLomd51A>) found on the district website. You may also fill in the paper form below and return it to your child's homeroom teacher or the District Office. Note: Your child does not have to take three classes. They can take one, two, or three if they so choose. Please remember if your child will not be here for the entire half day, you will need to provide transportation home.
3. All classes are assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis. Some classes may not run if there are not enough registrants. You will receive a confirmation list of your child's classes. If a class is canceled, your child will have an opportunity to sign-up for another selection.
4. The registration deadline is Friday, May 2nd.
5. Verification of class assignments will be sent home with the student the week of May 27th-May 30th.
6. Pick-up and drop-off for students being transported by their parents/guardians will be at the front door – S2. For students being transported by bus, this will take place at the normal location; doors by the MS/HS IMC.
7. Students are not allowed to be dropped off before 7:45 a.m.
8. Students are NOT allowed on campus unless they are enrolled in the summer program classes.
9. Breakfast will begin at 7:55 a.m.
10. Lunch will begin at 11:30 a.m.
11. If your child(ren) REQUIRES bus transportation, you are required to choose classes from all three (3) sessions and please do not forget to sign the forms!

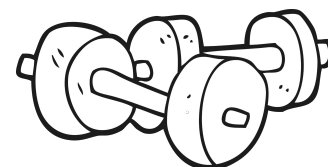
